

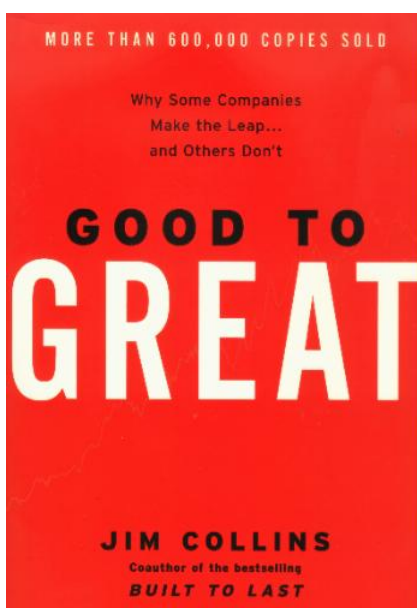
The Dark Secrets of Entrepreneurs
